Note that each side of the street had a row of utility poles, but there is now only a row on the north side.

Nearly all the frontages of the abutting private lots appear with large indigenous trees, many of which were River Red Gums (*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*) and Coast Manna Gums (*Eucalyptus viminalis* subsp. *pryoriana*). By 2017, the only remnants of those were the fine River Red Gums at Nos. 12, 14, and 16 Anita Street, and the Coast Manna Gum at No. 18 Anita Street.

Before the construction, a large River Red Gum grew in the middle of the road near its west end.

The road reservation is 410 metres long, and 14.8 metres wide, with a central carriageway 6.8 metres wide.
