

Sportsground Lighting project Beamauris Reserve 2013/14

To assist in the preservation of the sportsground surface for local residents as well as tenant sports clubs, Bayside City Council will install sportsground lighting at Beaumaris Reserve during the 2013/14 financial year.

To ensure that all relevant stakeholders of Beaumaris Reserve are aware of the proposed works and any impact's that they may have on users the following information overviews the planned improvements and the implementation timeframe.

Sportsground Lighting

The sportsground lighting system is a renewal of existing system that does not meet Australian Standards.

The installation of the sportsground lighting system will ensure the longevity of the newly reconstructed sportsground by enabling sports clubs to spread their training across the entire surface.

The project will include;

- Installation of four 30 metre poles with suitable lamp fittings to provide lighting that meets Australian Standards for soccer training.
- The lighting system will meet all relevant standards and mitigate light glare and spill into surrounding properties. This is achieved through the height of the poles and the positioning of the lamps, ensuring that the light is directed onto the sportsground and not into surrounding properties.
- It is proposed that the floodlighting will operate Monday to Friday evenings between 5.00 9.00pm April to September.
- Similar lighting systems currently operate within Bayside City Council at Chisholm Reserve, Duncan Street Sandringham, Castlefield Reserve, Ludston Street Hampton and Dendy Park, Breen Drive Brighton East and can be viewed between 6.00 – 8.00pm Monday to Friday, April to September.
- This project has been jointly funded by the Victorian State Government and Bayside City Council.
- The floodlighting system will be independently certified to meet the relevant Australian Standards.

Works are anticipated to commence in January 2014 and will be completed within 12 weeks

Can the sportsground still be used?

The sportsground will be open to the public throughout the construction stages. There will be restricted access on the days where the light poles are erected and lamps positioned – the dates will be advertised at the sportsground prior to the installation.

Where can I get more information?

For residents that would like further information regarding the project including the location of poles, training times and how the lamps are positioned to prevent impact on surround residences, an information session will be held at Beaumaris Reserve on Tuesday 20 August between 6.00 - 7.00pm.
